THEY'RE BACK: The Northern Ontario Junior Hockey League Copeland Cup – McNamara Cup champion Greater Sudbury Cubs are back competing in the Centennial Cup, presented by Tim Hortons, for a third consecutive year.

They became the sixth team in NOJHL history to win three, or more, consecutive league championships.

Greater Sudbury sees 15 players from last season's Centennial Cup squad available to compete in Summerside.

HOW THEY ARRIVED: After finishing first overall in the NOJHL standings in 2025-26, the Cubs rolled through the league playoffs, posting a trio of four-game series sweeps of the Kirkland Lake Gold Miners, Soo Eagles and the Timmins Rock to claim the league title.

PLAYOFF RECORD: 12-0 – **REGULAR SEASON RECORD:** 39-8-3-2 (1st overall)

DID YOU KNOW: In his playing days, current Cubs head coach Darryl Moxam captained the Rayside-Balfour Sabrecats in 1996-97 to a NOJHL title; a Dudley-Hewitt Cup Central Canadian crown and a berth into the national Jr. A championship. His on-ice efforts during that season saw him amass 100 points and go on to be named the Canadian Junior Hockey League's Player of the Year.

OPPONENTS: The Cubs have four round robin games on their docket in Summerside, beginning with the Ontario Junior Hockey League title holders, the Toronto Patriots. They'll then take on the Maritime Hockey League champion Truro Bearcats.

Greater Sudbury's third contest will be against the Flin Flon Bombers, who claimed the Saskatchewan Junior Hockey League crown. The Cubs will then meet Collège Français de Longueuil, winners of the Quebec AAA Junior Hockey League.

THE CUBS

Playoffs: Greater Sudbury went a perfect 12-0 in the postseason. ... With series wins over the Kirkland Lake Gold Miners, Soo Eagles and the Timmins Rock, Greater Sudbury outscored their opponents by a 70-27 count. ... Both numbers lead the league in their respective categories. ... The club was first overall in power play proficiency at 28.3%, notching a NOJHL-best 17-man advantage markers. ... The Cubs sat third on the penalty kill at 80.4% and supplied the most shorthanded markers scored with seven. ... They were 6-0 when scoring first and did likewise when their opponents connected first. ... Greater Sudbury did not to lose when leading after the first or second period as well as when outshooting the opposition.

Regular season: Greater Sudbury led the NOJHL in goals scored during the 2025-26 campaign with 298 and allowed the fewest-against, giving up just 124. ... They also placed four players in the Top 10 in league scoring and five in the Top 15. ... Tabbed seventh nationally in the final CJHL Rankings – Fuelled by Gatorade, the Cubs finished first in the NOJHL standings on 83 points with a league-best record of 39-8-3-2. ... They also led the way playing on home ice going 21-3-1-1 and were also tops on the road, sporting a 18-5-2-1 mark. ... They went 7-2-1-0 down the stretch. ... Clicking at an impressive 38.5% clip on the power play, they led the way in that department. ... Greater Sudbury was second overall on the penalty kill at 83.3%. ... The Cubs were the runaway leader in man advantage markers with 97 and were also first in shorthanded tallies with 19. ... When scoring first, the team went 27-5-1. ... Having the lead after the first period saw them go 30-2-1-0 and they were even better through 40 minutes at 34-2-0-0.

FORWARDS

Playoffs: Postseason MVP Mason Walker registered 27 points in 12 games for the Cubs in scoring with nine goals and 18 assists. ... Briir Long paced Greater Sudbury offensively with 28 points to his credit with 10 tallies and 18 helpers. ... Four of his tallies come on the man advantage. ... He and Walker shared top spot on the team in power play points with nine apiece. ... Third on the squad in offensive production was their captain, Daks Klinkhammer. ... He banged in 10 pucks and helped set-up nine more. ... Kaedyn Long averaged just over a point-per-game in the playoffs with 13 in a dozen appearances... He also topped the squad in game-winning goals with three, including one in Game 3 vs. Timmins, before notching the decider in overtime in Game 4 to secure the NOJHL championship.

Regular season: Despite missing the final three games and all of the playoffs due to injury, highly touted centre Nolan Newton still led the team in scoring on the campaign with 91 points in 45 outings, including picking up 37 tallies, which were the third-most in the league. ... Newton was second overall in NOJHL offensive numbers. ... Close behind him was crafty winger Mason Walker. ... He totalled career single-season bests in goals (33); assists (55) and points (88) in finishing third in league scoring. ... Goal-scoring machine Owen King pumped in 44 markers for the Cubs, to finish second overall among all league skaters, and helped set-up 30 others for 74 points. ... King led the league in power play tallies with 21, while Walker sat second at 15. ... Walker's eight game-winners shared the NOJHL lead in that department, with Newton holding down sixth in the category with six of his own. ... That trio combined for 119 power play points. ... Greater Sudbury captain Daks Klinkhammer was well over a point-per-game man with 65 in 45 outings. ... Eidan Macartney's seven shorthanded points tied him for top spot in the league.

DEFENCE

Playoffs: Spencer Horgan led the team and all league blueliners in postseason numbers with 16 points to his credit. ... Horgan did likewise in last year's playoffs as well with 25 points. ... His 14 assists in the 2026 playoffs paced all D-men. ... Alex Valade was next on the back end for the Cubs with eight points on four goals and four assists. ... Valade also led all NOJHL blueliners in game-winners with two. ... Nate Lazarus chipped in with six points from the point, including three in the final, while Tyson Rismond had five points and Cole Wreggitt supplied five.

Regular season: Record-setting defenceman Spencer Horgan had another tremendous year on the back end for the Cubs. ... He led all NOJHL blueliners in scoring with 72 points, which also placed him 10th overall among all league skaters. ... Horgan notched 19 markers, including 10 via the man advantage, and assisted on 53 others. ... He is the all-time leading point getter in the NOJHL by a defenceman with 228. ... Second-year D-man Alex Valade was next in numbers from the blueline as he established personal single-season bests in goals (10); assists (29) & points (39) to place him seventh in the NOJHL by defencemen. ... Four of his tallies came on the power play. ... Among the other 20-plus point men by the Cubs D were Tyson Rismond (28); Jacob Signoretti (25); Nate Laarus (23) and Kyle Navarro (23).

GOALTENDERS

Playoffs: Iain Wintle went a perfect 10-0 in the playoffs and led the way in goals-against average (2.05) and save percentage (.934) with one shutout. ... Matthew Vahramian won both his starts in the post season and was third in both average (2.93) and save mark (.917).

Regular season: Veteran Cubs' netminder Matthew Vahramian tied for the NOJHL-lead in goals-against average at 2.14 while sporting a 19-6-1-0 overall record. ... His win total was the second highest in the league, and he sat sixth in save percentage at .915, with two shutouts. ... Since joining Greater Sudbury in early December, Iain Wintle went unbeaten in regulation time, going 9-0-1-2 in 14 overall appearances. ... He also had a 2.28 GAA along with a save mark of .910 and posted a pair of shutouts.

AWARDS

Playoff MVP: Mason Walker – Racked up 27 points in 12 outings on nine goals and 18 assists. ... Registered points in 10 postseason games, that featured seven multi-point affairs.

Best Defenceman: Spencer Horgan – Is the NOJHL's all-time scoring leader among defencemen with 228 points. ... He paced all league blueliners in offensive production in 2025-26, with 72 points on 19 tallies and 53 assists. ... Finished 10th in league scoring among all players. ... Had 21 more points than any other blueliner. ... Selected a 1st Team NOJHL All-Star on defence.

Best Overall Team Player: Mason Walker – Among those who appeared in 35, or more contests, led the league in point-per-game average (2.26). ... Was third overall in points (88). ... Sat second in assists (55). ... Had a NOJHL-best 35 power play helpers and power play points (44). ... Tied for league lead in GWG (8). ... Was only held pointless in a contest three times. ... Solid playmaker with speed and vision that has seen him register 133 points in his first 85 games.

Wayne Chase Memorial Award – Best Goals-Against Average: Matthew Vahramian (Co-recipient) – finished with a league-low goals-against average of 2.14. ... Only allowed 58 goals-against on 681 shots faced.

James Aspen Trophy – Regular season champions – The Cubs went 39-8-3-2 to finish first overall in the NOJHL standings.

CJHL TIES: NOJHL commissioner Robert Mazzuca also serves as Chair of the Board for the Canadian Junior Hockey League. Mr. Mazzuca has held that role with the CJHL since 2021.

COMMITMENTS: A pair of key cogs to the success of the Cubs recently committed to a pair of OUA / USPORTS programs.

Cubs captain Daks Klinkhammer will be off to the University of Ontario Institute of Technology in Oshawa, Ont., where he will attend school and skate for the Ridgebacks men's hockey team.

Meanwhile, Greater Sudbury goaltender Iain Wintle is heading to the University of Guelph to further his education and man the nets with the Gryphons.

ALL-ONTARIO: Every player on the Cubs roster that is competing in the 2026 Centennial Cup, presented by Tim Hortons, all hail from the province of Ontario.

This includes 13 who are from Greater Sudbury and surrounding area.

RECORD SETTER: The Cubs' Spencer Horgan etched his name in the NOJHL record books earlier this season.

The veteran established a league mark for most career points by a defencemen with 228.

In all, Horgan collected 70 goals and helped set-up 158 others in 171 contests.

He also had 55 playoff points to his credit in 38 outings, with 14 markers and 41 helpers.

Horgan is also a finalist for this season's CJHL Top Defenceman award.

GOAL SCORER: Owen King has been a prolific goal-scorer in his time in the NOJHL.

In 80 career contests, the 19-year-old Cambridge, Ont., product has registered 94 goals.

This includes 13 hat tricks, featuring a trio of four-tally outings, and 16 game-winning markers.

POINT GETTER: In 51 total games this season, NOJHL Best Overall Team Player and Playoff MVP award recipient Mason Walker was only held pointless on five occasions.

Among his efforts were eight game-winning goals, which tied for the league lead.

Walker also assisted on six other deciding tallies.

ALMOST UNBEATABLE: Since being acquired by the Cubs in mid-December, goaltender Iain Wintle was nearly flawless.

He was a stellar 9-0-1-2 in regular season play and an equally crisp 8-0 in the postseason.

ON A ROLL: Dating back to last season, Greater Sudbury has won 13 straight playoff contests.

LAST TIME AROUND: At last year's Centennial Cup in Calgary, the Cubs posted an overall record of 2-3.

This included wins over the Grande Prairie Storm (AJHL) and the Kam River Fighting Walleye (SIJHL) to help them qualify for the playoff round.

However, they were upended by the Melfort Mustangs (SJHL) in quarter-final action.
